- 1. Chairman's Introduction Chairman thanked everyone for attending.

4. To confirm minutes of PC meeting on Monday 24th **October 2022** Minutes agreed as correct & signed by chairman Proposed LM Seconded JB

5. Matters arising from minutes of meeting on Monday 24th October 2022

LM gave a brief rundown of the pumping station history, informing the members that when the alarm went off, especially if there was heavy rain, it only took between 30 mins & 3hrs for local properties to flood. **Action point** AS to investigate further with the water company. **Agenda item next meeting**

The Clerk informed the members that EDF had sent an invoice for 3 months' supply (to 10/22) even though SSE supplied LKPC from 01/09/22. The Clerk had spoken to EDF and they were going to look into it.

The Clerk informed the members that Dog Fouling signs had been requested for Batteries Close from SBC ref number 15724598

7. Update from Borough Councillors

Local Plan would be on hold for approx. 18 months to 2 years.

A motion to ban the use of disposable BBQs in public places had been submitted to SBC.

At the next SBC finance & policy meeting it would be discussed if the parking fees be increased from 60p per 30 minutes to 65p per 30 minutes. It would also be discussed if the members' grants would be slashed from £2,400 pa to £1,000 pa. Final decision to be made at full council meeting in Feb 23

There were plans to build a double size school at the side of Teynham School in 2024 EV charging points in street bollards were being explored.

Swale House reopens on 19/12/22 after refurbishments.

SBC waste collection contracts were open for discussion and applications before going to full council meeting in Feb 23

Both Borough Councillors are still pushing for a GP to be re-located in Teynham/Lynsted

8. Update from County Councillor (incl congestion at Lynsted Lane/A2 Junction)

KCC had decided to cut the bus grants, therefore bus services in the local villages would cease to run after 12/02/23. However, Kent Karrier had scrapped their membership fees of £5 pa. The service runs Mon/Tue/Thurs and trips must be booked in advance for a return fee of £3.50

Cllr Lehmann to circulate details of a KCC Plan Tree scheme where £5,500 worth of trees were available. RL has agreed LKPC can have £500 out of this budget for tree allocation. **Agenda** item next meeting

The traffic congestion in Lynsted Lane at the junction with the A2 was discussed and no practical solutions were agreed given the need for residents to park outside their homes.

A request has been put into KCC to reduce the speed limit between Bapchild & Teynham to 40 mph which has been agreed.

The Clerk informed the members that the Paediatric pads in the defibrillator were out of date. It was agreed to purchase a new set. Proposed JS seconded LM **Action point** Clerk to purchase pads and place in defibrillator case

9e) Clerk's Salary review

After discussion it was agreed to award the Clerk an 8% rise in line with the 2022-2023 NALC National salary awards taking the remuneration to £9581 PA. Proposed JS Seconded AS

Cllrs Bowen & Whiting left the meeting

9f) Budget/Precept Review

The amended draft budget figures for 2023/2024 were discussed, taking into consideration the possibility that SBC may cut the lighting grant by 50% in 2023/24 and 2024/25, then scrap it completely. It was agreed by all to increase the precept for 2023/24 by 20% (£3,750) from £18,753 to £22,504. The increase would mean an increase on a band A property of £5.23 per household per year (44p per month) and on a band G property of £13.08 per household per year (£1.09 per month). Proposed JS Seconded LM. All other members in agreement with increase. **Action point** Clerk to complete the precept form when received and submit to SBC. JS to write to SBC objecting to the lighting grant reduction.

The Clerk informed the members that all the repairs, as agreed at the last meeting, have now been carried out. It had been ascertained that the two streetlights at the junction of Batteries Close/Lynsted Lane belonged to KCC highways and the Clerk had reported the faults on the KCC Highways fault line. After discussion it was agreed to carry out the final phase of the repairs at a cost of £906.25 + Vat. Proposed JS seconded JLB **Action point** Clerk to contact maintenance firm and instruct them to carry out the work

13b) Church Wall

KCC want the wall to be replaced with a concrete one with flint added afterwards. LKPC & SBC continue to lobby for the wall to be built like for like in the traditional rag stone design
